UPCOMING: RPI is right back here at the Houston Field House on Tuesday when American International comes to town for Rensselaer's final non-league game of the regular season ... Faceoff is 7pm.

NON-LEAGUE WINDING DOWN: The Engineers are 2-9-0 in non-conference contests ... They are 1-3-0 against the WCHA, 0-3-0 versus the CCHA, 1-1-0 against Atlantic Hockey, 0-1-0 versus ECAC Hockey and 0-1-0 against Hockey East ... RPI's final 13 contests are ECAC Hockey games.

RENSSELAER TO DATE: RPI has lost five straight games and six of its last seven ... It had won two of its previous three games prior to its current skid ... Rensselaer averages 1.33 goals on 25.3 shots per game with 15.7 penalty minutes per contest, which is 10th nationally ... The Engineers allow 3.17 goals and 27.3 shots per game ... The opposition averages 14.7 PIMs.

OFFENSIVE LEADERS: Junior Nick Bailen (3 goals, 4 assists), a defenseman, and sophomore Brock Higgs (1 goal, 8 assists), a forward, lead the team in scoring with nine points apiece... Freshman forwards Ryan Haggerty (team-high 4 goals, 3 assists) and Jacob Laliberte (2 goals, 5 assists) have seven points each ... Only Bailen has played all 18 contests ... Higgs and Laliberte have played 13 each, while Haggerty has played 15 contests.

2011-12 RENSSELAER MEN'S HOCKEY GAME NOTES

IN GOAL: Junior **Bryce Merriam** has started 13 of RPI's 18 games, posting a 2-11-0 record with a 2.68 goals against average and a .908 save percentage ... Freshman **Scott Diebold** has played the other five games, including three of the last five ... He is 1-4-0 with a 2.82 average and an .895 percentage ... Merriam and Diebold have one shutout each.

SPECIAL TEAMS: The Engineers are 10 for 86 (11.6%) on the power play ... RPI is 82 for 96 (85.4%) when shorthanded – good enough for 12th in the nation – with one goal for (**Alex Angers-Goulet**).

SCORING BY CLASS: Rensselaer's freshmen have scored 41.6% of the team's goals and 33.8% of its points ... The sophomores have 20.8% and 27.4%, while the juniors have 20.8% and 24.1% ... The Engineers' seniors have scored 16.6% of the goals and 14.5% of the points.

SCORING BY PERIOD: The Engineers have been outscored in each period, including 10 goals in the first period, just four in the second, but 19 in the third period.

TWO FOR: Rensselaer has scored exactly two goals in each of its last four games (0-4-0) and five of its last six (1-4-0).

STILL ON A ROLL: Freshman forward **Jacob Laliberte** recently had a six-game point streak (2 goals, 4 assists) snapped ... He now has a point in seven of his last eight games (2 goals, 5 assists).

THREE STRAIGHT: Sophomore forward **Brock Higgs** has a point in three straight games (1 goal, 2 assists) and at least one point in five of his last six (1 goal, 6 assists).

HEATING UP: Junior forward **CJ Lee** has a point in three of his last five games ... He has a goal and three assists in that span.

BACK TO NIGHT GAMES: After playing its first 15 games at night, Rensselaer's most recent three games all began at 4pm – and all three were neutral site games ... This weekend's contests start at 7:30pm and 7pm, respectively.

RENSSELAER LAST WEEK: RPI dropped both games of last week's Toyota UConn Hockey Classic, losing to #17 UMass Lowell, 7-2, and Army, 3-2 ... Against the nationally-ranked River Hawks, **CJ Lee** assisted on both goals for the Engineers, who fell behind 3-0 in the first period and could not pull close ...

Scott Diebold stopped 17 shots in the loss ... The next afternoon, Army overcame a third period deficit, scoring the final two goals for the victory ... The game-winner came with just 1:33 left in the final period ... RPI, which saw **Bryce Merriam** make 13 saves, scored both its goals on the power play.

NEAL RETURNS: Freshman forward **Matt Neal** returned to action after missing the previous 11 games due to a high ankle sprain.

FIRST GOALS: In the game against Army, both **Brock Higgs**, a sophomore, and **Matt Neal**, a freshman, scored their first goals of the season Higgs had nine goals as a freshman.

MOST GOALS AGAINST: The seven goals UMass Lowell scored last Thursday were the most the Engineers have allowed in a game this season.

HOT SHOT: RPI freshman **Ryan Haggarty** recorded a season-high six shots on goal against Army ... He also had six shots against Minnesota State on October 7 ... **Brock Higgs** notched six shots on goal against Yale on November 11.

LONGEST GAME: Last Friday's game against Army lasted two hours, 37 minutes, in part due to a 30 minute delay while the rink crew fixed a pane of glass that was shattered by a **Nick Bailen** shot midway through the third period ... It is the longest game RPI has played this season.

FEWEST SHOTS: The 16 shots allowed to Army last weekend were the fewest the Engineers have given up in a game this season.

RPI VS. DARTMOUTH ALL-TIME: The Engineers are 40-30-5 (.567) all-time against the Big Green, including a 4-1 win at Dartmouth and a 5-1 victory at home last year ... The series began on January 17, 1908, with a

4-4 tie in Albany, N.Y.

AT HOME: Rensselaer is 20-11-4 (.629) in home games against the Big Green.

IN LEAGUE PLAY: RPI has played Dartmouth 62 times in league games, posting a 33-25-4 (.565) record ... The .565 winning percentage is fourth highest for the Engineers in league play.

IN OVERTIME: RPI and Dartmouth have played 12 overtime games in their head-to-head history ... The Engineers are 7-0-5 (.792) in such contests.

SHUTOUTS: The Engineers have shut out Dartmouth twice all-time ... Both of those came in Troy, with the most recent being February 5, 2000, a 2-0 win backstopped by **Joel Laing**.

RECENTLY: Rensselaer has won five of the last six meetings with the Big Green ... The last 10 meetings have featured six RPI wins with one tie ... Prior to the last 10, Dartmouth posted eight straight victories.

RECENTLY IN TROY: The Engineers are 2-6-2 in their last 10 games against Dartmouth at Houston Field House.

UNDER APPERT: RPI is 6-7-1 against the Big Green with **Seth Appert** as its head coach ... Two of those wins came in the ECAC Playoffs, a two-game first round sweep in 2008-09 ... In Troy, the Engineers are 2-3-1 versus Dartmouth under Appert.

STREAKY: Since January 27, 2001, Dartmouth has an 18-9-3 record against the Engineers, including an eight-game winning streak ... In the 11 games prior to those 30 games, RPI held a 10-1-0 mark against the Big Green.

2010-11: Rensselaer captured both meetings with Dartmouth last season, winning 4-1 at Dartmouth and 5-1 at home.

NOVEMBER 5, 2010: Senior **Chase Polacek** notched two goals to lead Rensselaer to a 4-1 victory over Dartmouth ... **C.J. Lee** added a goal and an assist, while **Marty O'Grady** also scored for RPI ... **Allen York** finished with 25 saves in the win ... **Cab Morris** had 17 stops for Dartmouth, which got its goal from Jason Bourgea.

5-1 ... Four different players had multiple points, including **Joel Malchuk**, who had a goal and an assist ... **Nick Bailen** added two helpers and **Allen York** stopped 18 shots ... Eric Robinson scored a third period goal for the Big Green, which got 21 saves from James Mello and five from Jody O'Neill.

2009-10: The two teams split their two games in 2009-10 with both schools using big third periods to gain victory on its home ice.

JANUARY 22, 2010: Tyler Helfrich and Paul Kerins scored midway through the third period and **Allen York** stopped 27 shots as RPI defeated Dartmouth, 2-1, at Houston Field House ... Connor Goggin scored a shorthanded goal in the first period for the Big Green, which got 19 saves from James Mello.

FEBRUARY 13, 2010: Dartmouth scored twice within a minute late in the third period to turn a 3-2 deficit into a 4-3 win ... Four different players scored for the Big Green, including Nick Walsh and Kyle Reeds, who had a goal and an assist each ... Jody O'Neill made 27 saves for the win ... For RPI, **Chase Polacek** registered a hat trick and **Allen York** (11 saves) and **Bryce Merriam** (24) combined for 35 stops.

RPI VS. HARVARD ALL-TIME: The Engineers are 35-46-3 (.435) all-time against the Crimson, including a 1-0 loss in Cambridge and a 3-2 win at home last year ... The series began on December 27, 1951, a 6-2 RPI win in Troy.

FOURTH ALL-TIME: Rensselaer's 46 losses to Harvard is fourth most against any one opponent.

ALL-TIME AT HOME: The Engineers are 20-15-1 (.569) in 36 home games against the Crimson.

RECENTLY: In the last five meetings between RPI and Harvard, RPI is 3-1-1 ... The Crimson have a 5-4-1 edge in the last 10 matchups ... In the last 10 contests in Troy, Rensselaer is 5-4-1.

IN LEAGUE GAMES: The Engineers are 28-34-1 (.452) in 63 league games against the Crimson.

MODRY ADDS EXPERTISE: Over the course of his NHL career, volunteer assistant coach **Jaroslav Modry** played for the New Jersey Devils, Ottawa Senators, Los Angeles Kings, Atlanta Thrashers, Dallas Stars and Philadelphia Flyers ... In 725 games he scored 49 goals with 201 assists for 250 points ... He also played 28 playoff games, scoring once with six assists ... Modry played in the NHL All-Star Game in 2001-02.

BAILEN RECOGNIZED: Engineers junior defenseman **Nick Bailen** was selected to the All-ECAC Hockey Preseason Teams by both the coaches and the media ... He was a National All-America East Second Team selection after scoring eight goals with 28 assists for 36 points in 38 games last season ... He led ECAC Hockey in defensemen scoring.

FIRST NHL POINT: Former Engineers

standout **Brandon Pirri** registered the first point of his NHL career in the Chicago Blackhawks' season opening loss to Dallas ... Pirri had the secondary assist on a goal by Nick Leddy ... The game was the second in the NHL for Pirri, who played one season at RPI, totaling 43 points on 11 goals and 32 assists in 39 games in 2009-10 ... He has since played two more games with the Blackhawks, tallying another assist.

FIRST NHL GAME: Former Rensselaer netminder **Allen York** made his NHL debut with the Columbus Blue Jackets against Detroit on October 25 ... He made his first NHL start at Chicago on October 29 ... To date he has appeared in four games with the Blue Jackets this season, going 0-1-0 with a 3.53 goals against average and .878 save percentage ... He finished his career at RPI with a record of 37-33-8, 2.47 GAA, .915 save percentage and four shutouts in 83 career games ... He ranks first all-time in GAA and is fourth in percentage ... He was a two-time finalist for the Ken Dryden Award.

TWENTY-SECOND NHLER: With **Allen York** making his NHL debut earlier this season, he became the 22nd former Engineer to skate in the National Hockey League ... The others are **John Carter**, **Don Cutts**, **Marty Dallman**, **Mike Dark**, **Tim Friday**, **Ken Hammond**, **Eric Healey**, **Joe Juneau**, **Larry Landon**, **Neil Little**, **Mike McPhee**, **Matt Murley**, **Kraig Nienhuis**, **Adam Oates**, **Brandon Pirri**, **Brian Pothier**, **Daren Puppa**, **George Servinis**, **Steve Stoyanovich**, **Brad Tapper** and **Graeme Townshend**.

ALL-TIME NHL LEADERS: **Adam Oates** is the former Engineer with the most NHL games (1337), goals (341), assists (1079) and points (1420) ... **Mike McPhee** has the most NHL penalty minutes (661) and **Daren Puppa** has the most victories (179).

ONE NHL COACH: Former Rensselaer netminder **Kevin Constantine** has been the head coach of three different National Hockey League teams: San Jose, Pittsburgh and New Jersey.

BROTHERHOOD: Rensselaer forwards **Alex Angers-Goulet** and **Greg Burgdoerfer** both had brothers who played for the Engineers ... Alex's older brother, **Matt**, played for RPI from 2005-09, serving as the team's captain as a senior ... **Erik Burgdoerfer**, Greg's identical twin, was a defenseman for RPI from 2006-10.

HEAD COACH SETH APPERT

Seth Appert is in his sixth season as the head coach of the men's hockey program, having led Rensselaer to a 69-98-23 record while consistently playing one of the toughest schedules in the nation since taking over in April of 2006.

Last season was Appert's most successful to date at Rensselaer, as the Engineers posted a 20-13-5 record, a national ranking for most of the season and the program's first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1995. The team was 13-6-1 at the Houston Field House on its way to recording back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in nearly 10 years (2000-01 & 2001-02).

Individually, RPI had a number of student-athletes garner significant honors. Forward Chase Polacek earned ECAC Hockey Player of the Year, Hobey Baker Award finalist and National All-America – all for the second straight season. It is just the third time in the long history of ECAC Hockey that a player repeated as Player of the Year.

Defenseman Nick Bailen was also recognized with All-ECAC Hockey First Team as well as National All-American Second Team honors and goaltender Allen York was named to the league's Third Team.

At season's end, Appert signed a contract extension that will keep him in Troy through at least the 2017-18 season.

The 2009-10 campaign also featured a number of highlights as the Engineers finished with an 18-17-4 record, including a 10-9-3 mark in ECAC Hockey play. RPI earned home-ice advantage in the first round of the ECAC Hockey Playoffs for the first time since 2005-06. Polacek was one of 10 finalists for the prestigious Hobey Baker Award, while earning ECAC Hockey Player of the Year honors. Freshman Jerry D'Amigo was the league's Rookie of the Year and classmate Brandon Pirri joined him on the All-Rookie Team. York was a finalist for Goaltender of the Year in ECAC Hockey.

In 2008-09, Appert's Engineers swept Dartmouth in the ECAC Hockey Playoffs on their way to the quarterfinals, where they were eliminated in a decisive third game. The team's top four scorers were either freshmen or sophomores and one of those first-year players, Patrick Cullen, was named to ECAC Hockey's All-Rookie Team. Two of RPI's incoming recruits – Pirri and D'Amigo – were selected in the NHL Draft by Chicago and Toronto, respectively. They have since signed NHL contracts with those clubs.

Highlights during Appert's first two seasons include leading the Engineers to back-to-back titles in the Governor's Cup Tourna-



ment – Rensselaer's first championships of any kind since 1998 – and garnering points against six nationally-ranked opponents. RPI had a nationally-ranked recruiting classes and also enjoyed time in the national polls, including eight straight weeks in 2007-08.

Individually, Rensselaer student-athletes have earned All-League and All-Rookie status as well as having a Student-Athlete of the Year Award finalist and a Hockey Humanitarian Award finalist.

Specifically in Appert's first season, the Engineers captured the inaugural Governor's Cup Championship and won at nationally-ranked Denver – Appert's first career win, which came against his previous employer. Individually, senior defenseman Jake Luthi earned All-League, while classmate Kirk MacDonald, a forward, garnered the USCHO.com's Unsung Hero Award, as well as several national community service honors.

In 2007-08, Rensselaer's recruiting class was nationally-ranked, the Engineers captured the Governor's Cup, forward Andrew Lord was a finalist for the ECAC Hockey Scholar-Athlete Award and Polacek was selected to the ECAC Hockey All-Rookie Team.

In addition to his position at RPI, Appert has worked with USA Hockey in a number of capacities. He was an assistant coach for the 2007 U.S. Under-18 Select Team that competed in the Memorial of Ivan Hlinka Tournament and was the head coach in both 2008 and 2011. He was also a coach in the 2008 NCAA Pontiac Skills Challenge and was named president of the AHCA, which has almost 1,400 members, in May of 2008. Appert is currently the AHCA Past President.

"In just one year Seth has become an important member of the Rensselaer community with a very positive influence across the campus," said President Shirley Ann Jackson upon the announcement of Appert's first contract extension. "He has shown a willingness to meet challenges head on and a determination to succeed. These are attributes that will

continue to shape outstanding young men, while generating a great deal of excitement and increasing levels of success on the ice."

"Seth's ambition and enthusiasm fit perfectly for Rensselaer," said then-Vice President of Student Life Eddie Ade Knowles. "When looking at the outstanding young men he recruits, as well as the eagerness to play the best teams in the country, there is no doubt we will again become one of the nation's elite programs. I look forward to working with him for many years to come."

"I am very thankful to President Jackson and Dr. Knowles for their continued support of our program and the vision and leadership they provide for our university," said Appert. "We have set a strong foundation for future success and we will continue to move this program forward with the support from the RPI campus community and our terrific fans in the Capital Region. This is our home and my wife and I are excited about raising our kids here while bringing RPI hockey back to national prominence."

Appert, the 12th head men's hockey coach in the storied program's history, spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Denver, where he was responsible for recruiting, on-ice coaching, video breakdown and game analysis work. He also played a big role in the development of the Pioneers' goaltenders.

A collegiate netminder at Ferris State University, Appert individually coached one All-America, two All-WCHA honorees, two WCHA Playoff Most Valuable Players and two Frozen Four Most Outstanding Players at Denver.

Three of his goaltenders were draft picks of the NHL, including one Hobey Baker Award finalist. All three of those netminders have played in the NHL in recent years.

Appert, who was born August 9, 1974, helped Denver sign numerous nationally-ranked recruiting classes during his nine-year tenure with the Pioneers. Among those he coached or recruited at Denver were the 2006 Hobey Baker Award winner, eight All-Americans, a WCHA Player of the Year, 22 All-WCHA picks, three WCHA Defensive Players of the Year, two WCHA Student-Athletes of the Year and 17 NHL draft picks. The Pioneers averaged over 23 wins per year during his tenure as an assistant coach and captured two NCAA National Championships, three WCHA playoff championships and two WCHA regular-season titles.

A four-year letterwinner at Ferris State from 1992-96, Appert and his wife, Jill, have two daughters, Addison, who is seven, and Campbell, who was born in June 2007.
