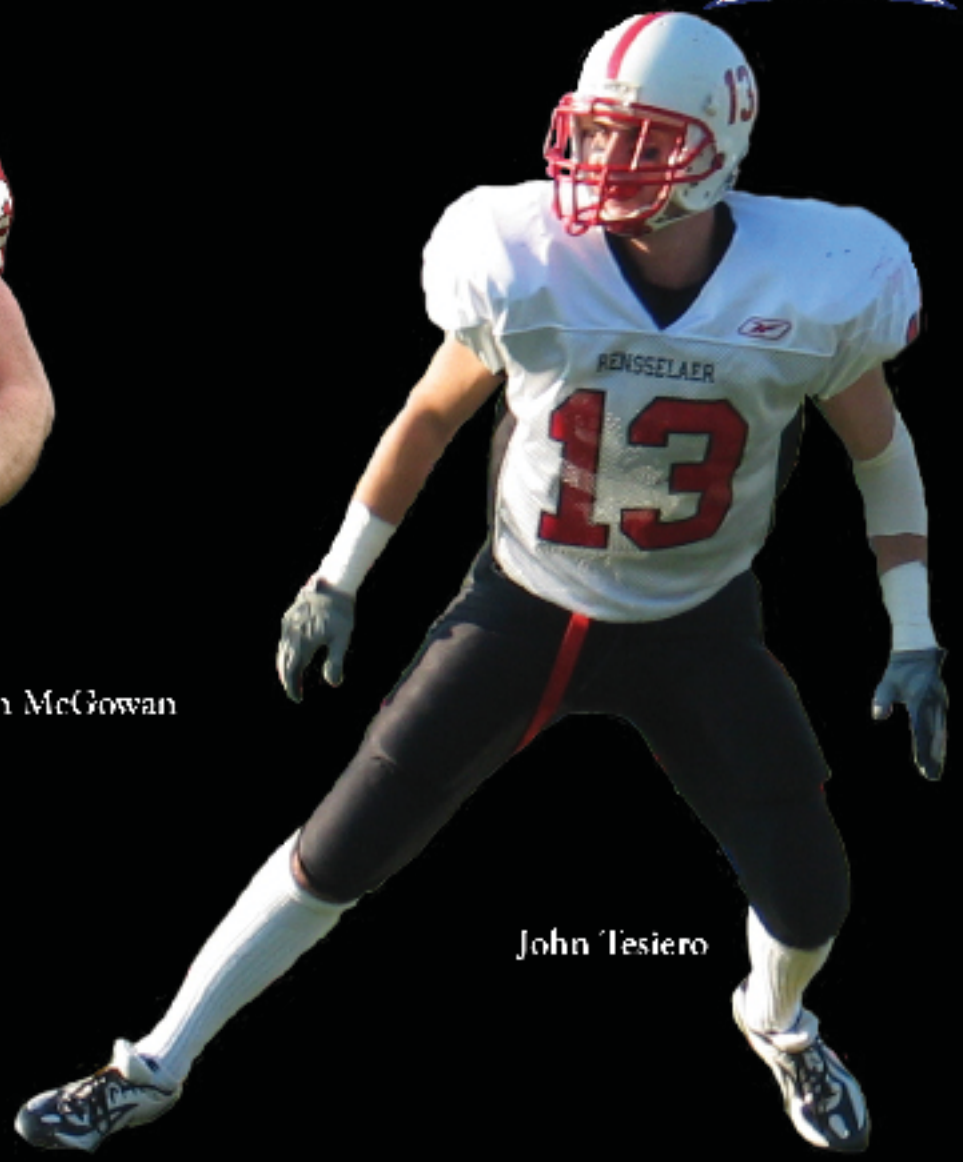

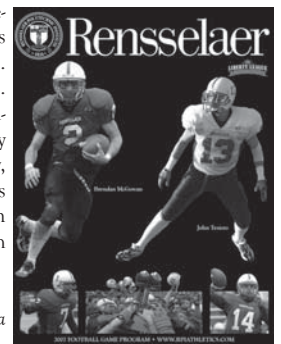

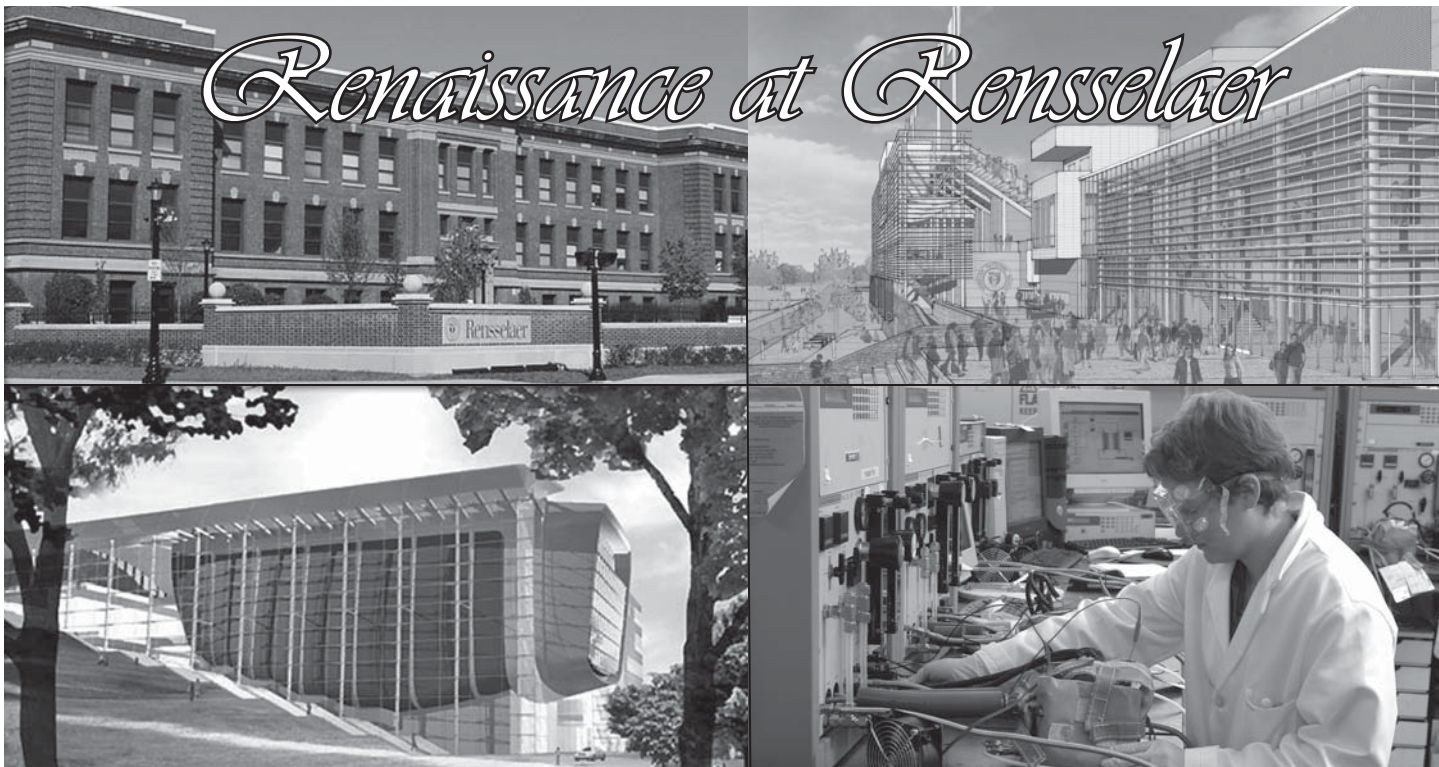

Shirley Ann Jackson, Ph.D., is the 18th President of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.



She has held senior leadership positions in government, industry, research, and academe. Included among her numerous advisory

roles and involvement in prestigious national organizations, she is the former president of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) and former chairman of its Board of Directors; a member of the National Academy of Engineering, The American Philosophical Society, the Council on Foreign Relations; and a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the American Physical Society, and the AAAS. She serves on the board of directors of NYSE Euronext and chairs the NYSE Regulation Board. She is a director of several major corporations. Dr. Jackson served as chairman of the U.S.

Nuclear Regulatory Commission from 1995 to 1998. Describing her as "a national treasure," the National Science Board selected Jackson as its

2007 recipient of the Vannevar Bush Award for "a lifetime of achievements in scientific research, education, and senior statesman-like contributions to public policy."

For more than 60 years, the Career Development Center (CDC) has offered students the opportunity to participate in our innovative Cooperative Education Program (co-op), which takes you out of the classroom for an entire semester (plus a summer) and into a full-time



position at any number of top companies and organizations.

Want to see the world? Studying abroad expands a student's cultural horizons, offering a new and extended perspective on a technological education. Rensselaer encourages students to consider integrating an experience away from campus during their junior or senior year; opportunities are available at more than 70 universities worldwide, including programs in Ireland, Australia, and Japan.



DID YOU KNOW?

- The incoming Class of 2011 promises to be an exceptional group, with the average SAT score up almost 20 points from the previous year, and more than 65 percent of the students coming from the top 10 percent of their high school classes. Competition was tight for the approximately 1,300 spots in the incoming class, with more than 10,100 students filing applications this year. This record number is a nearly 50 percent increase over the previous year and represents a growth of 82 percent in just two years, according to the Office of Enrollment Management.

- The Institute recently added a bachelor of science degree in Design, Innovation, and Society, while also launching a new undergraduate degree program in Games and Simulation Arts & Sciences (GSAS). The major – which builds off the success of the School of Humanities and Social Sciences' highly popular game studies minor, created in 2004 – will equip graduates with a suite of integrated skills necessary for leaders in the game development industry.

- In 1996 *U.S. News & World Report* ranked Rensselaer 42nd among the nation's top universities, up from 43rd from 2005. The Institute also ranks 24th in the "Best Values" among national universities, up from 27th in 2005. Rensselaer's School of Engineering is ranked 19th in the nation.

- The 2007 *BusinessWeek* rankings of undergraduate business programs has attracted many students to consider studying management at Rensselaer. The Lally School of Management & Technology is one of nine new schools to be named to the latest list of top 50 undergraduate business programs, making its debut at number 40. Magazine staffers also asked 80,000 business majors at 123 schools to rank their programs on a scale of one to five in different academic categories. Rensselaer's Lally School of Management & Technology came in at number two in the nation in the area of corporate strategy.

> The really cool thing about going to college in Troy (aside from Rensselaer itself) is that you are in the heart of New York's Capital Region; you are so close to so much. The history, eateries, culture, shops, and festivals of Troy and Albany are minutes away. A bit farther and you're swimming, hiking, or sightseeing at gorgeous Lake George (54 miles away). Famous havens like Cooperstown (81) and Saratoga Springs (29) are a quick drive away. Take Manhattan (162) or explore downtown Boston (174). Get just a little more ambitious and check out Niagara Falls (306) near Buffalo (293) or Toronto (387), or head on up to Montreal (216).



ACTING DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS KEVIN BEATTIE



Kevin Beattie was named acting director of athletics at Rensselaer on July 24, 2007. In that position he is responsible for providing leadership and management for the Institute's intercollegiate, intramural, and recreational athletic programs. As Rensselaer's representative, with status as a multi-divisional member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), Beattie oversees two Division I – men's and women's ice hockey – and 21 Division III varsity teams. Eleven of RPI's sports, which involve a total of 600 student-athletes, are women's.

The school's director of athletic communication, Beattie joined Rensselaer in August 1998. His responsibilities include generating and handling publicity, media and public relations for Rensselaer's 23 varsity athletics teams, including its Division I men's and women's ice hockey teams.

He also writes, edits and designs athletic department press releases and publications, including media guides, programs and brochures; maintains the department's Web page; serves as a liaison with local, regional and national media; prepares, edits and distributes game-day materials; compiles, maintains and distributes statistics; researches, purchases and writes newspaper, television and radio advertisements for the department; nominates student-athletes, coaches and staff members for various honors and awards; and manages and organizes the sports information staff, including a full-time assistant, work-study students and game-day personnel.

Beattie also has been the director of media relations for numerous NCAA Division I Men's Hockey Championships at the Times Union Center, including the 2001 Frozen Four. He is also Rensselaer's Athletics Hall of Fame selection committee chair, serving as a member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), serving as a member of the Academic All-America Committee, as well as ECAC-SIDA, for which he is a frequent panelist at educational workshops.

He also has served on numerous committees at Rensselaer, including

the search for current head men's hockey coach Seth Appert, as well as the Athletics Task Force for Marketing and Promotion Sub-Committee. He also has worked on various projects with ECAC Hockey.

Prior to his tenure at Rensselaer, Beattie was the director of communications for the Albany River Rats for four years, including the 1994-95 season when the team won the Calder Cup. In that role he was the main liaison between the organization and the media as well as the New Jersey Devils' and American Hockey League's communications departments.



Beattie was responsible for writing and disseminating press releases; writing, editing and producing all team publications; contacting media for feature stories and arranging player interviews; performing promotional and radio interviews; providing color commentary on radio broadcasts; and coordinating internships and evaluating students' performances. He was also an account executive charged with selling corporate sponsorships, season tickets and group ticket packages.

Beattie was Rensselaer's 2000 Person of the Year, the first-ever selected by the readers and staff of *The Polytechnic*, Rensselaer's student-newspaper and a recipient of the 2004 Mark of Excellence Award from American Marketing Association Capital Region Chapter.

A native of nearby Wynantskill, N.Y., Beattie earned a Master of Business Administration from Rensselaer's prestigious Lally School of Management & Technology in 2005. He holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Oneonta State.

Beattie and his wife, Stacey, reside in Niskayuna with their two young children, Nolan and Ella.

ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS KAREN HANSEN



Karen Hansen is in her third year as associate athletic director. Among her duties in this role are handling the business and finance operations for the athletic department as well as corporate relations.

Hansen came to Rensselaer from Bloomsburg University in Bloomsburg, Pa., where she was the director of athletic operations. Her duties included game scheduling for all 18 varsity sports, liaison between all athletic support staff members, game setup for all home athletic contests and post-season tournaments, and overseeing a student work-study staff of 25 that served as event workers and weight room monitors. She was also responsible for maintaining financial databases for summer camps,

work-study budgets, sport-specific attendance records, transportation, and other programs on campus.

In 1999, Hansen worked for *The Pocono Record* in Stroudsburg, Pa., where she compiled local sports agate into articles and wrote features on area athletes, coaches and sports administrators. She also worked that year with the Lehigh Valley Steam professional soccer team in Easton, Pa., serving as the event management, promotions, and marketing intern. Her responsibilities included writing field usage proposals, stadium setup for game-day operations, obtaining corporate sponsorships, and setup of community clinics.

Hansen is a 2000 graduate of East Stroudsburg University in Pennsylvania with a master's degree in sports management and administration. She received her bachelor's degree in physical education from East Stroudsburg in 1997.

THE 2007 SEASON OUTLOOK

The 2007 season for the Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) football team should be one of opportunity. For the team, the opportunity to build on a seven-win season, including a pair of victories over nationally-ranked opponents. For the student-athletes, an opportunity to overcome the loss of 15 teammates to graduation. And for the coaching staff, led by 19th-year mentor Joe King, an opportunity to regain Liberty League supremacy and earn another trip to the NCAA Playoffs.

Offensively, the Engineers return five starters, including their quarterback and wide receivers from a team that averaged 31.3 points and 358.7 yards per game. However, they must overcome the loss of an All-America running back, a multiple All-America tight end and four starting offensive linemen.

Seven starters are back on defense, including three defensive linemen, a linebacker and three defensive backs. In addition, all four second-unit down linemen return to a squad that held the opposition to 17.6 points per game and only 90.8 rushing yards per contest. On special teams the punter returns but both the kicker and return specialist graduated.

OFFENSIVE OVERVIEW

THE QUARTERBACKS

For the third year, RPI's signal caller will be Jimmy Robertson (Yonkers, NY/Iona Prep), a junior who has posted a 14-5 record as a starter, including wins in the last two ECAC championship games.

Last season as a sophomore Robertson, who is 6-1, 200 pounds, led the Engineers to an average of 31.3 points per game, which was 25th in the

nation. He completed 168 of 288 passes (58.3%) for 2,160 yards with 16 touchdowns and only six interceptions in ten games. He averaged 216.0 yards per game and finished with a 135.50 efficiency rating. Robertson, who ranked among the nation's best in four individual categories, also rushed for 181 net yards.

In two years of college competition he has completed almost 60% of his passes (361-of-613 for 58.9%) with 42 touchdowns and only 14 interceptions.

Senior Josh Chiappone (Troy, NY/Troy), a third-year varsity player, and sophomore Will Gottschalk (Calabasas, CA/Crespi Carmalite), who started on the junior varsity in 2006, fill out the depth chart at quarterback.

THE RUNNING BACKS

Though inexperienced at running back, in particular at tailback, the Engineers are talented. Junior Isaac Williams (Clifton Park, NY/Shenendehowa) and sophomore Jason Sgarlata (Canastota, NY/Canastota) both have a chance to take over the starting tailback position, vacated with the graduation of All-America Jay Bernardo.

Williams, who is 6-1, 200 pounds, was the team's second leading rusher with 184 yards and two touchdowns on 44 carries. He ran for 108 yards as a freshman. Sgarlata, who was a standout on the junior varsity, rushed for 104 yards and two scores in his only varsity game last year. Also vying for carries will be sophomore Kyle Blackman (Ft. Montgomery, NY/James I. O'Neil), who played JV football and varsity lacrosse in his first year.

RPI does have a seasoned pair to play fullback in juniors Mike Giacoia (Marlboro, NY/Marlboro) and Justin Heafy (Cheshire, CT/Cheshire).

Giacoia started as a freshman before sitting out last season with an injury, while Heafy was the top blocking back a year ago.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS

With five of its top six wide receivers in the fold, this group is one of the strengths of the team.



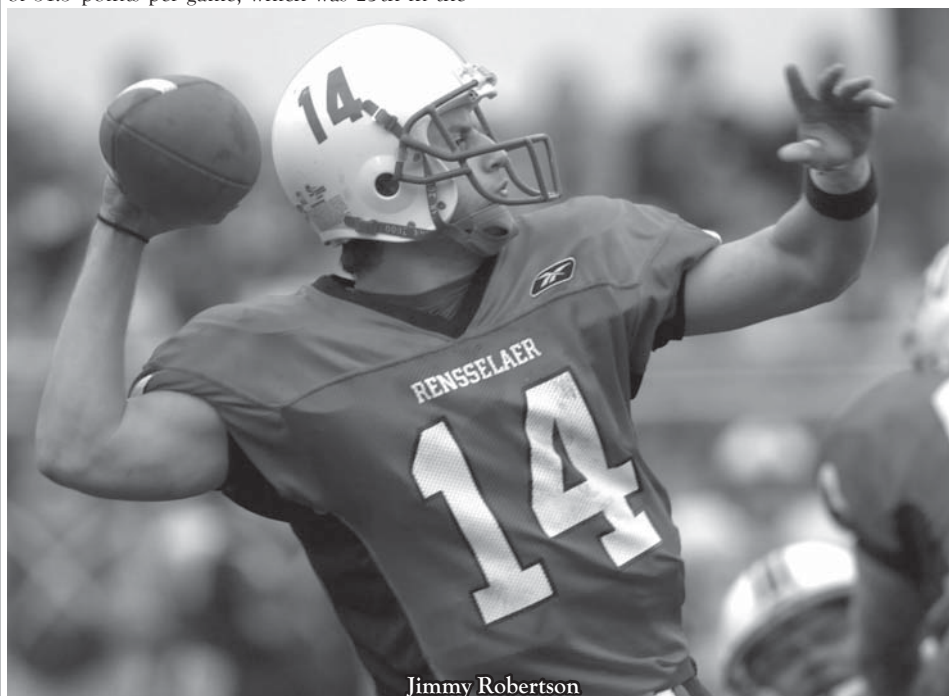

Senior Brendan McGowan (Mesa, AZ/Mountainview) leads the way, having made 61 catches for 767 yards - both team-bests - with five touchdowns as a junior. He was 26th nationally in receptions per game (6.1). McGowan, a three-time All-Liberty League selection, now has 178 receptions for 2,125 yards and 17 touchdowns in 29 career games.

Junior Eren Savasli (Brooklyn, NY/Brooklyn Tech.), the team's Offensive Most Improved Player, had 27 receptions for 426 yards for a team-best 16.1 yards per catch. Four of his catches were touchdowns. Like Savasli, senior Chris Graef (Bethel, CT/Bethel) also started all ten games, collecting 21 passes for 185 yards. Senior Drew Utschig (Harrison, NY/Iona Prep) and sophomore Mike Fil (Wynantskill, NY/Averill Park) both provide additional options for the offense.

THE TIGHT ENDS

Senior Jason Reed (Cohoes, NY/Shaker), who is 6-4, 235 pounds, was the team's primary blocker from the tight end spot a season ago. In addition to that role this year, he will see more passes thrown his way as the Engineers attempt to overcome the loss of Jon Branche, a multiple All-America who set the Division III record for receptions in a career at his position. Sophomore Colton Hill (Troy, NY/Tamarac), who played fullback as a freshman, has been switched to tight end to compete for time on the field.

THE OFFENSIVE LINE

With just one starter back Rensselaer's offensive line will be inexperienced, but not short on talent or ability. The Engineers have strength, quickness and intelligence.

Senior Grant Sanville (Westfield, VT/North Country), who played left guard last season, returns to the starting lineup. Also expected to be on the first unit is Jasmin Ibric (New York, NY/Brooklyn Tech.), a 6-3, 250 pound junior who can play several positions.

Fighting for starting positions will be sophomore Brian Hall (Penn Yan, NY/Penn Yan Academy) and seniors Dave Dillen (Grand Island, NY/Grand Island), Dave Lutian (Milford, CT/Jonathan Law) and James Porambo (Jim Thorpe, PA/Marian Catholic). Hall (6-5, 240), Lutian (6-2, 270) and Porambo (6-4, 305), the team's short snapper, all boast the size to open substantial holes for the backs and the agility to pass block.

DEFENSIVE OVERVIEW

THE DEFENSIVE LINE

In the trenches on the defensive side of the ball RPI is experienced and deep. Three starters are among the seven of the eight from the season-ending two-deep who return. Senior Vince Scicchitano (Centerport, NY/Harborfields) and juniors Nick Casale (Waterford, NY/LaSalle Institute) and James McLaughlin (Foxboro, MA/Foxboro) hold down the group.

Casale led the down linemen with 43 tackles, including 20 unassisted, six for lost yards (22) and two sacks (15 yards lost), while Scicchitano, the team's Defensive Most Improved Player, registered 38 tackles (20 solos) with seven sacks (27 yards lost), two forced fumbles, a safety and an interception. McLaughlin made 40 tackles (23 solos), including team-bests of nine sacks (39 yards lost) and ten tackles for lost yards (41). McLaughlin, who was 21st nationally in sacks per game (0.9), and Scicchitano were All-Liberty League Honorable Mention selections and Casale earned All-League honors as a defender in la-

crose.

Each of the four members of the second unit also return, led by senior Doug Ingraham (Grand Island, NY/Grand Island), a fourth-year varsity performer. The 6-3, 250 pounder finished with four tackles for lost yards (18) and two sacks (14 yards lost) despite missing several games. Junior Khaly Merot (White Plains, NY/White Plains) chipped in with 19 tackles (9 solos), a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a pass breakup and classmates Jerry Campbell (New Hyde Park, NY/New Hyde Park) and Alex Kelsen (Marcellus, NY/Skaneateles) also registered significant playing time late in the campaign.

Dan Belber (Niskayuna, NY/Niskayuna) and T.J. Kieper (Selkirk, NY/Bishop Maginn), both of whom have experience on the defensive line and at linebacker, and Ian Johnson (Brick, NJ/Brick Township) - all seniors - provide versatility and depth.

THE LINEBACKERS

The middle of the defense features senior Tom Rayhill (Grand Island, NY/Grand Island), a fourth-year varsity performer and third-year starter. The team's top returning tackler, he finished with 74 stops, including 40 unassisted, six for lost yards (34) and two sacks (20 yards). An All-League Honorable Mention selection, Rayhill also had an interception (in the end zone), a pass breakup, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.

Eight other linebackers, including four seniors and two juniors, are back, although they

have limited varsity experience at the position. Anthony Casale (Troy, NY/Troy), a senior, and Koby Greene (Granville, NY/Granville), a junior, combined for 16 tackles a season ago. Junior Mark Sangiorgi (Wyckoff, NJ/Ramapo), a converted defensive back who had 19 tackles and an interception in 2006, and sophomores Colin King (Glenmont, NY/Ravena) and Tom Montano (Gloversville, NY/Gloversville), two junior varsity standouts as freshmen, will be in the mix for starting positions.

Seniors Brett Eastman (Newtown, CT/Newtown), Jake Kluka (Boothwyn, PA/Chichester) and Kevin MacCracken (Scotia, NY/Scotia-Glenville) also have an opportunity to play important roles for the Engineers in their final seasons.

THE SECONDARY

Returning captain John Tesiero (Amsterdam, NY/Amsterdam) leads a defensive secondary that features six returnees, including three starters. A senior, Tesiero made 22 tackles (16 solos) with a team-high four interceptions and three pass breakups in eight games. He also forced a fumble and recovered a loose ball.

Brett Perron (Windham, NH/Central Catholic), a graduate student, has the most tackles of the defensive backs who return. A starter in all ten games, he recorded 36 tackles, including 21 unassisted, two interceptions with 71 return yards, and four pass breakups. Sophomore Tim Acker (Arlington, WA/Arlington), who took over a starting spot midway through the season, was next with 34 tackles (18 solos). The team's Rookie of the Year, he added an interception with a 40-yard return, four pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

Junior Pete Rankis (Acton, MA/Acton-Boxborough), who had 15 tackles and an interception in ten games, and sophomores Bobby Stutz (Dobbs Ferry, NY/Dobbs Ferry) and Joe Albano (Dalton, MA/Wahconah Regional) compete for the spot vacated by All-League performer Adam LoGiudice, who graduated.

SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

THE KICKERS

While there will be a new kicker, Rayhill, the snapper, and McGowan, the holder, are back to assist with the transition.

THE PUNTERS

Senior JT Engstrom (Branford, CT/Notre Dame) and sopho-

more Nick Duncan (Voorheesville, NY/Voorheesville) go head-to-head for the punting duties for the second straight campaign. Engstrom averaged 32.0 yards, including a 44-yard long, with two inside the 20 yard line in 21 attempts as a junior, while Duncan, who also plays wide receiver, averaged 33.7 yards on 20 tries. He had a long of 42 yards with six inside the 20.

THE RETURNERS

Fil, who has outstanding speed, will receive the kickoffs and punts, replacing LoGiudice, who was an All-America a year ago. The sophomore returned one kickoff for 22 yards and one punt for 21 yards in 2006.

COACHING STAFF

THE HEAD COACH

King, Rensselaer's winningest coach of all-time, has a 125-47-2 record for a .724 winning percentage, making him the most successful football coach in terms of wins and winning percentage in the 120-year history of the program. Over the past 15 seasons he has a combined 111-36 (.755) mark, including two perfect regular seasons (9-0 in 1999, 8-0 in 2001), four league championships (1997, 1998, 1999, 2001), seven ECAC Bowl ap-

pearances (1992, 1993, 1995, 1997, 2002, 2005, 2006) - all wins - and three NCAA Playoff appearances (1999, 2001, 2003), highlighted by a trip to the National Semifinals in 2003.

In the past four years the Engineers have 31 wins and have played in six playoff games - posting a 5-1 record in the post-season.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES

Among the assistant coaches returning are both coordinators. Pat DelMonaco, the offensive coordinator who also serves as the offensive line coach, is back for his fifth season while Chad Martinovich, the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach, returns for his fourth campaign. In addition, eight other assistant coaches are back on the sidelines while a couple of new aides have been added.

SCHEDULE OVERVIEW

Rensselaer opens the 2007 season with two non-league home games, September 8 against Endicott (1pm) and September 15 versus Utica (1pm).

RPI kicks off its six-game Liberty League schedule - and its road slate - on September 22 at Hobart in a key league matchup beginning at 1pm. A trip to new league member Susquehanna - the

first meeting between the two schools - on September 29 (1:30pm) follows. The Engineers host St. Lawrence on October 6 and Merchant Marine on October 20 for Homecoming Weekend. Both games, which are league contests, begin at 1pm.

The final three weeks show RPI going to WPI for the Transit Trophy Game on October 27 (2pm), home against Rochester for Senior Day on November 3 (1pm) and at Union for the Dutchman Shoes Trophy Game and regular season finale on November 10 (12pm).

ON THE AIR, ON THE WEB & LIVE STATS

Every game - home and away - is broadcast live on RPI's student station, WRPI, 91.5 FM, and on the Internet at www.wrpi.org.

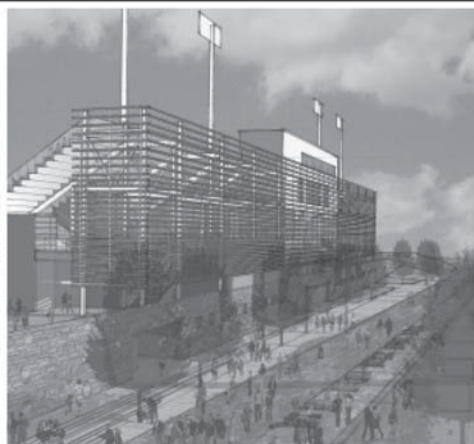
New this season, all home games are shown live on the Internet on a pay per view basis with B2Networks.

HEAD COACH JOE KING



Rensselaer's winningest head football coach of all time, Joe King returns to the sidelines of '86 Field for his 19th season at the helm.

During his tenure, King has taken the program, which began in 1886, to new heights. In his 18 years he has compiled a 125-47-2 record for a .724 winning percentage, making him the most successful football coach in terms of wins and winning percentage in the 120-year history of Rensselaer football.

Over the past 15 seasons, King has a combined 111-33 (.771) mark, including two perfect regular seasons (9-0 in 1999, 8-0 in 2001), four league championships (1997, 1998, 1999, 2001), seven ECAC Championship Game appearances (1992, 1993, 1995, 1997, 2002, 2005, 2006) – all wins – and three NCAA Playoff appearances (1999, 2001, 2003).

In the past four years the Engineers posted 31 wins and have played in six playoff games – boasting a 5-1 record in the post-season.

The highlight of King's tenure at Rensselaer thus far came in 2003, when he led the Engineers to a school-record 11 wins (11-2) and a spot in the Division III National Semi-Finals for the first time in school history. It was RPI's third NCAA Tournament appearance – and fourth trip to the post-season – in the past five years. Among the team's 11 victories were wins in all three Trophy Games and the school's first three NCAA Tournament wins.

The Engineers ranked among the leaders in the nation in numerous statistical categories and established more than 50 school records. They were listed in the top ten in the final national rankings in every poll and were recognized as the ECAC Division III Upstate Team of the Year. RPI was also the recipient of the prestigious Lambert Meadowlands Team of the Year Award. Five

players earned All-America recognition and King and his staff were honored as the league's Coaching Staff of the Year. In addition, King was selected as the East Region Coach of the Year, the Division III Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports, and Rensselaer's Coach of the Year, as selected by the school's coaching staff.

The 2001 season marked the second time in the past three the Engineers posted an undefeated regular season (8-0) and were selected to the 28-team NCAA Playoffs. RPI, which won its fourth league title in the past five years that season, was the top seed in the East Region and played in the second round of the national tournament for the first time in school history.

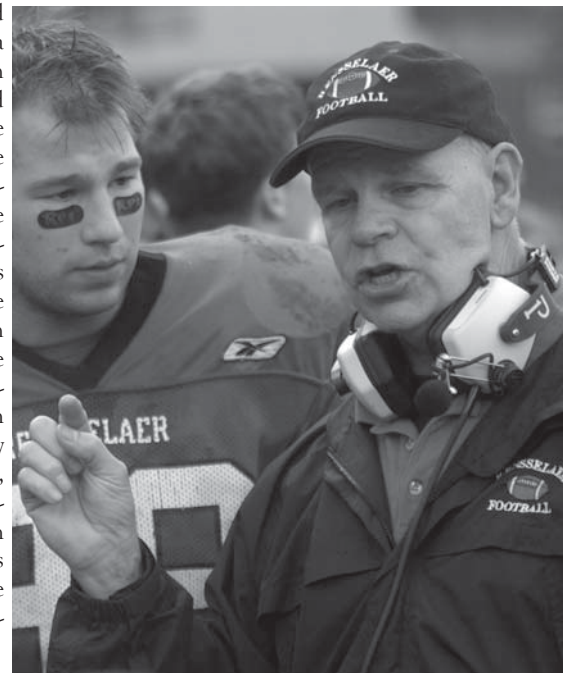
The 1999 campaign saw the Engineers win their third straight league title while compiling a perfect regular season (9-0) on their way to being invited to the NCAA Playoffs for the first time ever. In addition, the team climbed to its highest rankings ever at that time in two national polls. RPI also led the nation in turnover margin, ranked third in scoring defense, sixth in pass efficiency defense and seventh in rushing defense.

King, a four-time league Coach of the Year, also led the Engineers to a tremendous season in 1999 when Rensselaer won nine straight games on its way to finishing 9-1. The only loss came in overtime to eventual NCAA qualifier Coast Guard in the season opener. RPI won its fourth ECAC title in six years and King and his assistants earned league Staff of the Year honors as well as the ECAC Upstate New York award.

Since King took over the reigns in 1989 more than 30 pre-season All-Americans, 20 post-season All-Americans (including Rensselaer's first American Football Coaches Association First Team All-America in 1996) and countless All-Region and All-Conference honorees have worn the RPI uniform. Additionally, all eight of the school's First Team National Academic All-Americans have suited up for King. Under his tutelage, the Engineers have tied or set almost every school record.

A native of nearby Ballston Spa, N.Y., King is accustomed to winning, not only in college but also at the high school level, earning an impressive 52-23-3 (.686) record. He began his coaching career at St. Peter's High School in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., where he served as athletic director, football coach and baseball coach. He turned around a football program that had not claimed a single win in the previous five seasons. In his second year, King led St. Peter's to a 7-1 record, as well as to ninth place in the New York State rankings. He also led the baseball team to the Parochial League Championship in his two seasons as head coach.

After two years at St. Peter's, King went on to Watervliet High School, where he inherited a program that had only one winning season in 23 years. In his seven years with the Cannoneers, he compiled a 44-16-2 (.726) mark. He guided the team to six winning seasons, including 1979 when it went 8-0-1 and won the Section 2 Class C title. While at Watervliet, King, who also taught social studies, was named the Troy Area High School Coach of

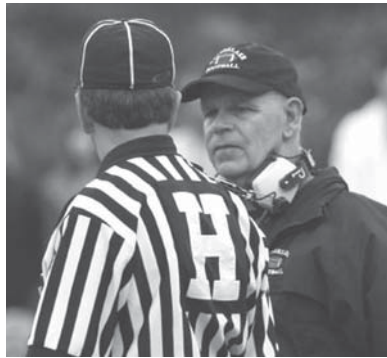

the Year by *The Record* four times and the Capitaland High School Coach of the Year once by the *Times Union*. Among the players he mentored was Tim Sherwin, who went on to have a standout career as a tight end with the Baltimore Colts and the New York Giants in the National Football League.

King, who was named the 2002 Rensselaer Person of the



Year by the staff of *The Polytechnic*, the student newspaper, as well as the Coach of the Year by the Institute's coaching staff, arrived at Rensselaer in 1981, spending his first five seasons as an assistant coach. He then enjoyed a three-year stint as associate head coach before being appointed head coach in 1989.

In addition to his duties as head football coach, King also serves as an assistant athletic director, a position he has held for the past seven years. Among his duties in that role are handling the athletic department's internship program, coordinating game-day management and heading the department's safety issues and concerns. He has also been RPI's head track & field coach.

A 1970 graduate of Siena College with a bachelor's degree in history, King played football and baseball as an undergraduate.

He and his wife, Gail, make their home in Saratoga Springs. They have two grown sons, Joe, who assists the program with recruiting, and Kevin, who is an assistant coach with the Engineers.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES



PAT DELMONACO Offensive Coordinator & Offensive Line

Pasquale "Pat" DelMonaco, Jr. joined the Rensselaer staff in 2003.

The offensive line coach since his arrival, he is in his third year as the offensive coordinator and fourth as the recruiting coordinator.

Last season he helped the Engineers average 31.3 points and 358.7 yards per game, including 140.8 yards rushing. The offensive line allowed just 16 sacks as the team led the Liberty League in scoring offense, first downs (185), red zone offense (88.6%) and third down conversions (42.4%) and ranked 25th in the nation in scoring offense.

In the 2005 season, RPI led the league in scoring (33.5 points per game) behind league Rookie of the Year, quarterback Jimmy Robertson.

During DelMonaco's first two seasons, the Engineers averaged over 5.7 yards per play and more than 425 yards per contest, including 281 passing. The team rushed for over 100 yards in 12 of 21 games and over 200 yards five times. Rensselaer's quarterbacks threw for over 300 yards nine times and over 400 yards on four occasions.

DelMonaco, whose offensive line allowed only six sacks in 2004, joined the Engineers from Hudson Valley Community College, where he coached the offensive line in his first two years and the quarterbacks in his third and final season. Between his second and third year with the Vikings he was a graduate assistant with the offensive line at the University of Illinois.

As a player, the Sleepy Hollow, N.Y., native played center at the University of Albany from 1996 to 2000, captaining the team as a senior. During his four years the Great Danes posted a 35-7 record and won two Eastern Football Conference Championships (1997, 1998).

DelMonaco, who earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in history in 2000, resides in Niskayuna with his wife, Kelly, and their children, Julia and Pasquale.

As a senior Cole threw for 3,679 yards, 40 touchdowns and just 11 interceptions in 13 games, leading the Engineers to a school-record 11 wins (11-2) and the NCAA National Semi Finals. The Liberty League Offensive Performer of the Week four times, he also ran for 276 yards and two touchdowns. He was voted the Offensive Player of the Year by the Liberty League and the ECAC and was a multiple National All-America. He went on to a tryout with the NFL's New England Patriots and in the CFL.

Cole, the team's Offensive Most Valuable Player three times during his career, graduated in 2004 with an EMAC degree.

He spent 2007 season with the Albany Conquest of af2.



PETE COSTANZA

Defensive Backs

Pete Costanza is in his second season coaching at Rensselaer.

A New Jersey native, he is the head coach of the Albany Conquest of af2. Among his responsibilities with the Conquest are all day-to-day football operations, player signings and recruiting, and coordinating the game plans for both the offense and defense.

- 9 Paramount circuit training stations

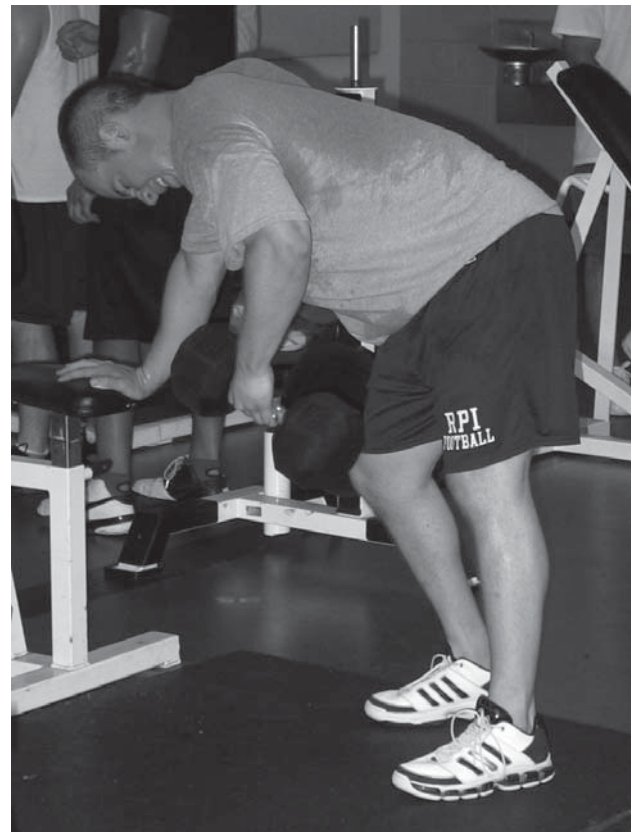

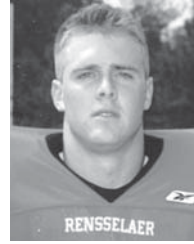

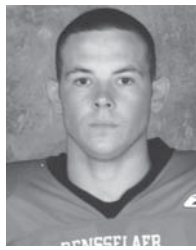

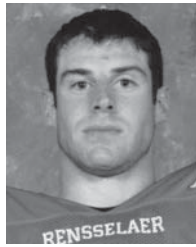

The Liberty League sponsors championships in 24 sports. The member institutions of the league place the highest priority on the overall quality of the educational experience and on the successful completion of its student-athletes' academic programs.

The member institutions seek to establish and maintain an environment in which a student-athlete's athletic activities are conducted as an integral part of the educational experience.

Originally founded as the United States Collegiate Athletic Association in 1995, the confer-



ence was renamed the Liberty League (www.libertyleaguesports.org) during the summer of 2004. The current league includes founding members Clarkson University, Hamilton College, Hobart and William Smith Colleges, the University of Rochester, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, St. Lawrence University, Skidmore College and Union College. 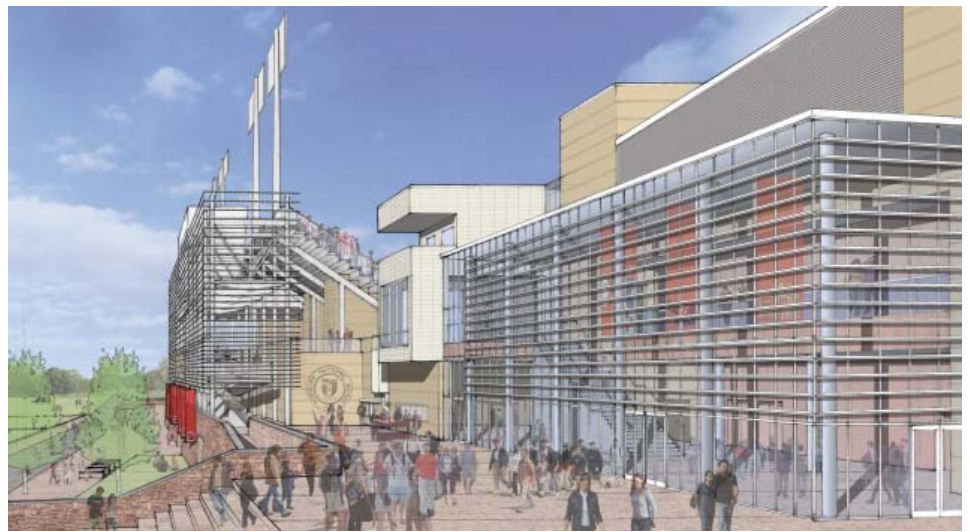

East Campus Athletic Village Groundbreaking

August 26, 2007, was a historic day on the Rensselaer campus as the Institute hosted the official groundbreaking ceremony to launch the first phase of the \$110 million East Campus Athletic Village. The most extensive athletic construction project in the Institute's history, the new athletic village will improve dramatically campus athletic facilities, expand athletic opportunities, and enhance the overall student experience at Rensselaer. The project will include a 4,800-seat multipurpose open air stadium with synthetic turf, a 1,200-seat basketball arena, improvements to the Houston Field House, a strength and conditioning center, an administrative center, indoor pool, outdoor tennis courts, and indoor sports facility complete with a track and tennis courts. Public spaces will include an atrium, lobby, cafe, and pro shop.
